This vocabulary is taken from the Primary <u>National Curriculum</u> for English. It can be found in the Vocabulary, Grammar and Punctuation section (page 65-69). Vocabulary from previous years is revised, used and consolidated each year.

New vocabulary is introduced as appropriate depending on the texts used, then revisited throughout the year to consolidate.

Each text will bring its own vocabulary found within it; this is planned for and taught in addition to the vocabulary listed above.

Children are also taught a range of vocabulary through their spellings. We use the 'Read Write Inc' spelling scheme, which looks at the definitions of the words as well as the spelling rules.
