

PE AT GLYNWOOD

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- PE is taught to each year group throughout the year.
- Every child is timetabled to have 2 hours of PE a week.
- Each year group is expected to cover: Dance, Gymnastics, Games (Net and wall, Striking and Fielding and Invasion), Athletics, Outdoor Adventurous Activities and Swimming (in allocated years).
- All children are given the opportunity to attend afterschool clubs, in a range of sports, across the year.
- Glynwood is part of the School Sports Partnership. All year groups are given the opportunity to sign up to sports competitions each term and a team of children are selected to participate.

PE SCHEME

- PE lessons are taught using the Get Set 4 PE Scheme. Following the scheme ensures progression of skills across the years.
- The PE scheme is a guide for teachers to use. Teachers follow each unit of PE and teach the relevant skills required to achieve the objectives. Teachers have the autonomy to adapt and change lessons.
- A Curriculum Map is provided to ensure a wide range of sports are covered and ensures there is a natural progression through a student's PE journey.
- Lessons focus on self-improvement and personal best.
- Learning objectives/skills from the scheme should inform future learning; these skills should be made explicit at the start, throughout and at the end of every lesson.

ASSESSMENT

- PE assessment is used to understand pupil performance, to inform short and long term planning and to guide pupils progression.
- Children are encouraged to assess and evaluate their own development and be able to discuss it comfortably with others. Peer and self-assessments should be used regularly throughout a unit of PE allowing the children opportunities to observe, discuss and feedback with others.
- Progression should focus on specific skills, with a 'personal best' philosophy, and discussed with children so they can see how much they have improved.
- Teachers should use the schemes assessment criteria and objects to help inform their own assessment.
- Assessment for each sport should be recorded on the class assessment sheet.

RESOURCES

- Staff are responsible for checking their year groups equipment list and making sure they have the relevant equipment in school. If not, staff must make sure the PE coordinator is aware so that equipment can be ordered.
- Any damaged equipment should be reported to the PE coordinator.
- Staff are responsible for returning the equipment after each lesson to make sure it is available for others to use.
